Palomar exists for survivors. We accomplish our comprehensive services for victims of abuse through collaboration. We are grateful for all of our co-located partners and auxiliary partners coming together to address client's real time and future needs. Working together opens the pathways to identify gaps in service and ways to fill them. As an example, our first in the nation animal advocacy partnership allowed hundreds of people this past year to seek safety and care for their pets, historically quite a barrier to seeking assistance.

We recognize the caring work of our staff to create a safe, warm, and healing hospitality based model, navigating clients through every stage of assistance from triage to classes. ***This past year, over 5 thousand individuals received 48 thousand services.*** Our Children's Sanctuary expanded programming and we sincerely appreciate the staff, interns and volunteers that keep kids in a therapeutic and innovative safe environment while their loved ones meet with our navigators and partner services.

We are grateful beyond measure for all of our Hope giver supporters and volunteers that come alongside Palomar allowing us to help so many, truly break cycles and save lives. 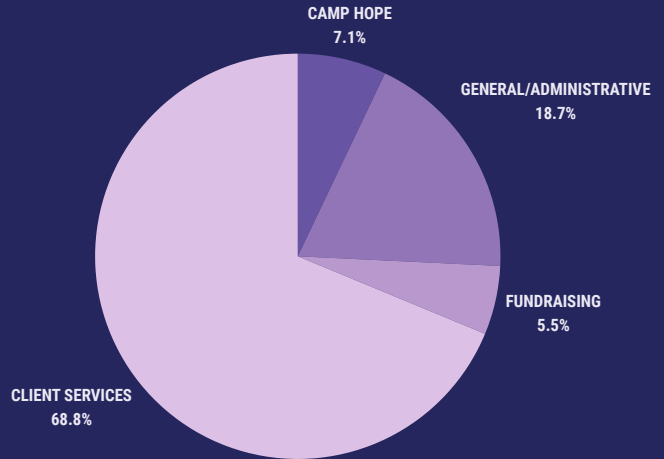


REVENUE

The ACE Study proves the direct correlation between exposure to trauma as a child and long term negative effects as an adult.

One study found that persons scoring a 4+ were twice as likely to be smokers, 12 times more likely to have attempted suicide, 7 times more likely to be alcoholic and 10 times more likely to have injected street drugs than individuals who scored 0.

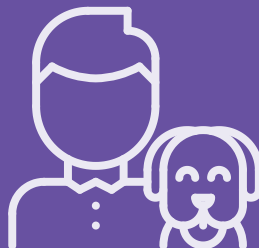
